#### Wellies:

We have had an increasing number of children come into school with fruit juice/squash in their bottles. Children can only drink water during the day. The exception is at lunchtime where they can have fruit juice/squash. If your child brings juice in their water bottle, they will be provided with a cup of water. If your child has a food allergy that may result in anaphylaxis it is **vital** that you have informed the school office and that we have any medications required in school.

Food intolerances should also be reported to the school office, so that a note can be placed on your child's record. However, all of our menus with a full ingredients and allergen lists are available on the website/app, under the 'parents' tab. It is your responsibility to ensure the meals booked for your child are suitable for their dietary requirements.
