- Collaborating with Halas Homes to promote physical activity and wellbeing
 - Increased empathy and understanding towards people with disabilities as children and members get together at least every team to continue working on the Halesowen in Bloom project (gardening) and enjoy seasonal activities together.
 - Encourage children to think about taking an active role in the community children, parents, governors and teachers took part in the Black Country Fun Run in 2016 to raise money for Halas Homes day care activities and Year 6 attend the summer activity day every year.
 - Improved the health and wellbeing of members of Halas homes by being involved in the above activities.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Increase activity of children at playtimes in order to meet the recommended 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school. Year 6 data showed 33% were not active at playtime. Working with Sports Leaders to improve and look at suggested initiatives.
- Teacher confidence and accuracy in the assessment of PE.
- Increase intra school games opportunities for C4L pupils.
